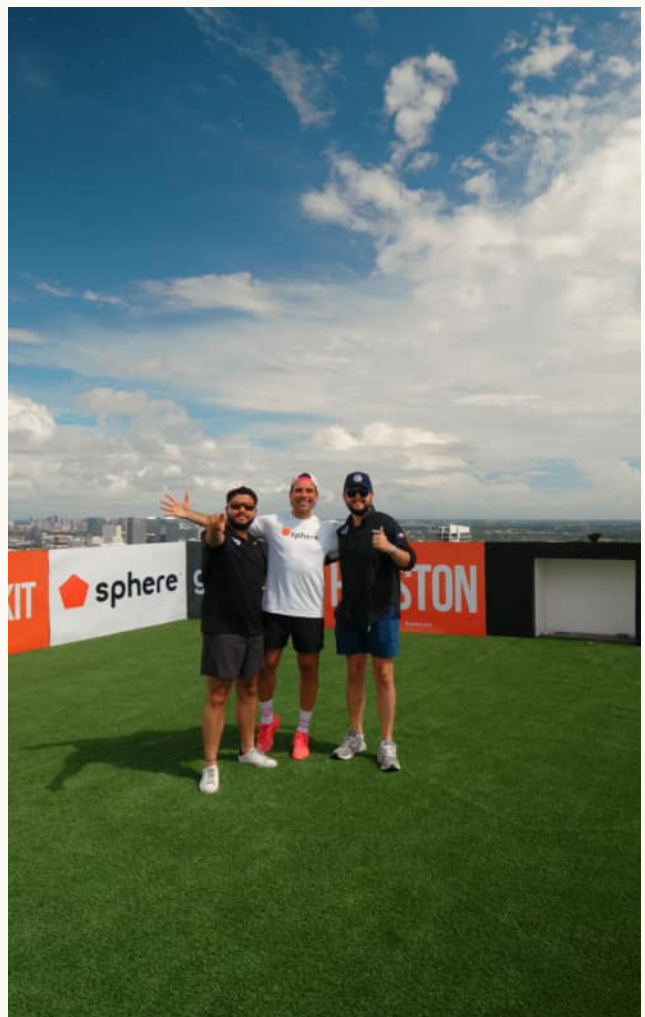

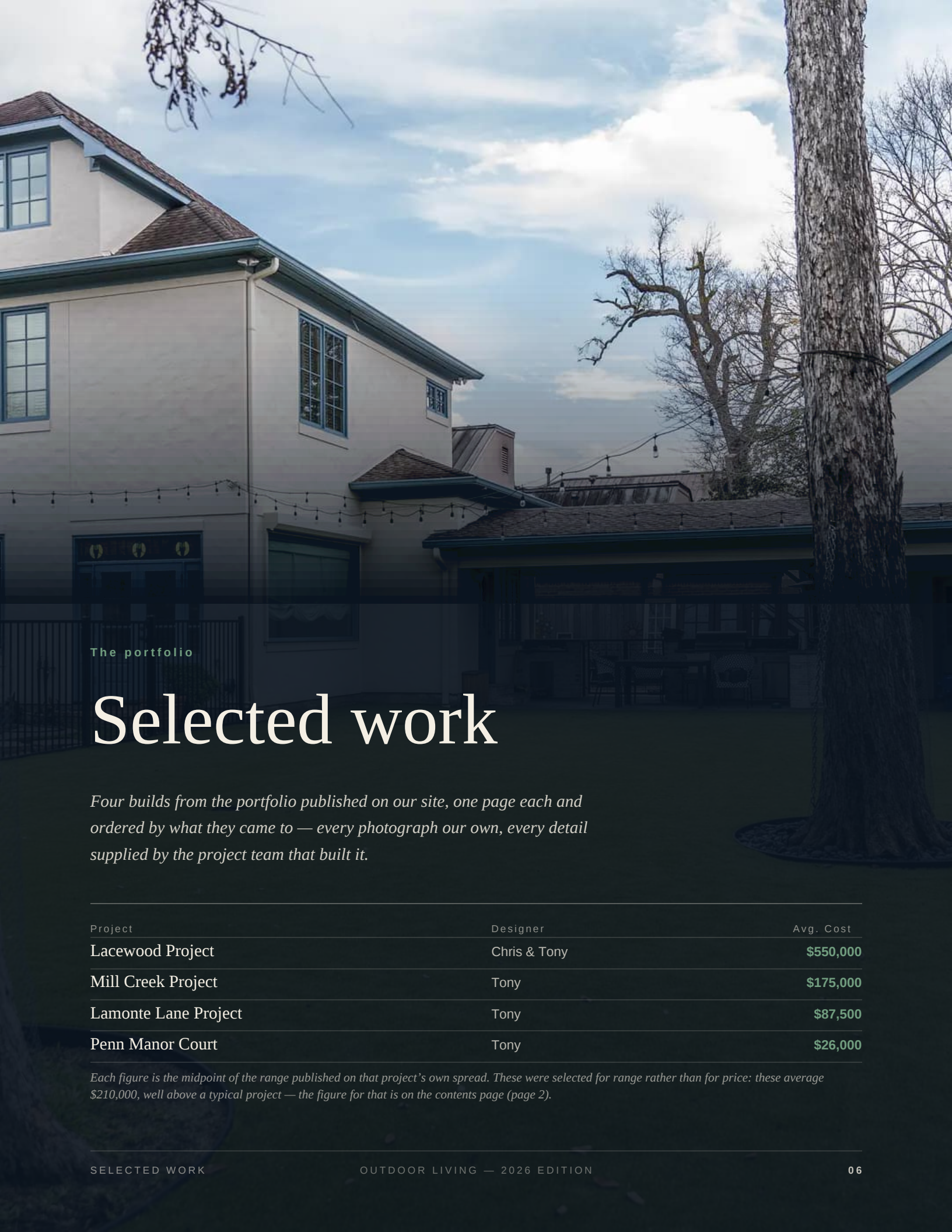

The portfolio

Each figure is the midpoint of the range published on that project's own spread. These were selected for range rather than for price: these average \$210,000, well above a typical project — the figure for that is on the contents page (page 2).

Lacewood Project

Piney Point, Houston, TX · Designed by Chris & Tony · \$500,000 – \$600,000



PHOTOGRAPH — THE PROPERTY AS BUILT

A two-acre Piney Point property rebuilt with symmetry and intention — a custom patio cover over a limestone and leathered granite kitchen, travertine paving, large limestone planters and premium turf.

Set within the prestigious Piney Point Village, this full-scale transformation was designed to elevate every inch of the exterior with intention, symmetry, and timeless detail. Spanning over two acres, the project required months of design planning to ensure every element worked together seamlessly.

The front of the property was reimagined to create a grand, structured arrival. Mature 200-gallon live oak trees establish scale and separation from the street, while custom limestone-clad planters and large-format cast stone steppers set in black star gravel guide you toward the home. Layered landscaping, which includes agaves, magnolias, evergreens, and sculpted boxwoods, adds depth and balance throughout.

Mill Creek Project

Magnolia, Texas • Designed by Tony • \$165,000 – \$185,000

A custom outdoor build in Magnolia, Texas that turned a river slope into usable elevations — a reinforced retaining wall system carrying a multi-gable patio cover and a white pergola, with a sunken fire pit and Emerald Zoysia lawn below.

Located in Magnolia, Texas, this custom outdoor build shows how intentional design and quality craftsmanship can completely transform a property. The goal was to create usable elevations, preserve natural light, and layer covered and open-air spaces for entertaining and everyday living.

The project began with extensive structural work to address the natural slope toward the nearby river. We constructed a reinforced retaining wall system with deep concrete footings and compacted crushed concrete to safely build up the grade. Oversized 10×10 posts and Dimension 12 pavers with border stone formed the foundation for the outdoor living areas.

03 · OUTDOOR KITCHEN, PERGOLA & BACKYARD RENOVATION

Lamonte Lane Project

Garden Oaks, Houston, TX · Designed by Tony · \$85,000 – \$90,000

A Houston backyard rebuilt around the pool it already had — a 15×27 black aluminum pergola with a polycarbonate roof, a 10-foot outdoor kitchen, renovated beds and lighting, and the paver deck re-levelled throughout.

The pool, spa and paver deck were already in place on this Houston property. What the yard did not have was shade over the part of it people actually used, anywhere to cook, or planting and lighting to hold the space together — so the work was a renovation of an existing backyard rather than a build from bare ground, sequenced around a pool that stayed in service.

Penn Manor Court

Spring Valley, Houston, TX · Designed by Tony · \$24,000 – \$28,000

A 2,500 sq ft pet turf installation that answered a muddy backyard and two large dogs — durable turf with cooling irrigation, new drainage infrastructure and landscape lighting.

Check out this 2,500 sq. ft. pet turf installation we recently completed! The homeowner reached out to us looking for a solution to a muddy backyard caused by their large dogs, which was tracking dirt into the house. Our solution? High-quality pet turf designed for durability, drainage, and a lush, green look year-round.

To ensure optimal drainage and odor control, we left select sprinkler heads active to help rinse the turf and incorporated a catch basin system to handle runoff. The turf itself features premium infill, keeping it fresh and clean with minimal maintenance—just a light fluffing from time to time.

For added ambiance, we installed wash lights throughout the space, creating a warm and inviting atmosphere in the evenings. Uplights on the trees and accent lighting along the walls enhance depth and highlight the backyard's features.

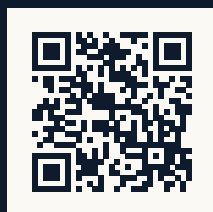

How a project runs

From the first walk of the property to support after handoff. The same five stages on every project, whatever its size.



01

Consultation

Walk the property together. Sun and shade, grade, drainage, soil, access, how the family wants to use the yard, and the budget it has to fit.

02

Design

Develop the layout — terraces, structures, lawn, planting, and water — with materials, levels, and lighting resolved together rather than one at a time.

03

Planning & Permitting

Finalize selections, drainage and irrigation design, permitting and HOA submittals, and the construction documents the crews build from.

04

Construction

Demolition, grading and drainage, base preparation, hardscape, structures, turf or sod, planting, irrigation, and lighting — sequenced and supervised.

05

Completion

Final grade and clean-up, irrigation and lighting programming, a walkthrough of how to care for it, and support after handoff.

What design costs

Design is real work, so it is priced as its own scope. Both packages carry the same drawing set — 3D design, 2D measured drawings, material and supply details, a planting schedule, lighting and irrigation plans, and additional revisions. Dream Design is the reduced rate for homeowners who intend to build with us.

Dream Design — \$1,200

Ideal for homeowners planning to build with Texan Landscape Group. This plan is offered at a discounted rate to support clients who are ready to move forward with us and need our design expertise to create a vision that matches their budget and style.

Design Only — \$2,500

Ideal for homeowners seeking a professional full-scope design from Texan Landscape Group but who may want to explore building the project themselves or comparing with other contractors.

ADD-ONS EITHER PACKAGE CAN CARRY

Scope you can add to either one

The drawings for the yard itself — 2D measurements, lighting, irrigation, planting — are in both packages already. These sit outside them, and are quoted with the design because what each one takes depends on the property. Bring the ones you want to the consultation.

Engineering — Engineered and stamped drawings for the elements that require them before a permit or an inspection will pass — structures, retaining walls, and anything carrying load.

Full-Property Drainage Plan — Grade and water movement resolved across the whole lot rather than just the area being built — where water arrives, where it goes, and what carries it there.

Phasing Plan — The design split into stages that each stand on their own, so the yard can be built over two or three seasons without redoing work.

HOA / Permit Submittal Set — The drawings packaged in the form a review board or the city asks for, so an approval is not waiting on paperwork after the design is finished.

3D Walkthrough Animation — A moving video walkthrough of the design rather than still views — useful for a large property, and for showing the plan to family who cannot stand in the yard.

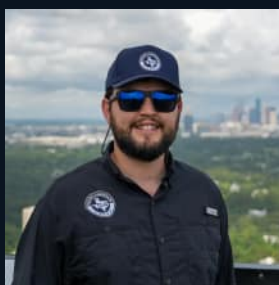

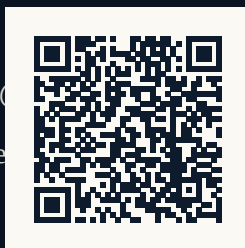
